The Sutter-Meyer society had many accomplishments to be proud of in 2011. Here is just a partial list:

- We opened the farmhouse museum to the public with a successful preview party of our first exhibit, created by an UMSL graduate student.
- We held a successful membership drive in September, receiving contributions that totaled \$3300.
- Our first Fall Festival in November was a hit. It included tours of the farmhouse, games and art activities, story-telling, weaving, and vendors selling old-fashioned crafts and food products.
- Through our educational outreach program, we brought three Jackson Park Elementary School classes to the farmhouse for hands-on learning activities.
- We produced our first DVD, beginning our efforts to collect shared personal histories.
- Eagle Scouts planted a herb garden near the house. The garden was watered by member volunteers during the dry summer months.
- We replaced the broken-down floor in the back room with recycled wood flooring (it has been sanded and stained, and looks beautiful). Other floors were cleaned and refreshed to show off their original wood.

- Our program will include a showing of Bill Streeter's film, "**Brick, by Chance and Fortune.**" Mr. Streeter is a well-known St. Louis film maker and designer. This film, a documentary on the past, present, and future of brick-making and building in St. Louis, was funded by a grant from CALOP (the Commission for Access and Local Original Programming) in University City. Bricks, you ask? What could possibly be interesting about bricks? You'll be wonderfully surprised when you see this film. You will look at brick structures in St. Louis in a whole new way.
- We will also hold our annual **silent auction** during the course of the evening. We'll have some really great items, including English bone china trios (five of them in different patterns that we'll be selling together), and beautiful leather Harley Davidson jackets and riding chaps. And much more! You won't want to miss out.

Accomplishments (continued):

- We landscaped in front of the house and around the ramp, also replacing deteriorated front walkway with donated sod.
- U City installed a new driveway.
- U City approved our plans for a frame and cover for the limestone well.
- We received a grant from Gargoyles to repair the dilapidated back porch.
- We installed picture molding to hold panels in the exhibit.
- Our annual meeting featured a talk by historian Esley Hamilton about the history and architecture of Pershing School, which was later demolished. We received a donation of bricks from the school building
